STEM - MAKING ICE CREAM

The students explored the science behind making ice cream and discovered that rock salt, when added to ice, can lower its freezing point. When the ice starts to melt the salt mixes with it making it colder than the frozen ice. This makes the perfect environment to make ice cream. Students shook bags of heavy cream, which were enclosed in a bag of ice and rock salt. They noticed that the cream quickly became very cold and solidified.
